Recipients must present a prescription for the breast pump and documentation of delivery date to a DME provider. Coverage extends only to personal-use, double electric breast pumps. Hospital grade, manual or single breast pumps will not be covered. Nursing mothers will be eligible for one breast pump per delivery within a three-year period. The billable code for the breast pump will be E0603.
